## ***MAALL 2001 : MEET US IN ST LOUIS***

**A**lthough the program for the MAALL annual meeting is packed full, you will want to save time for exploring some of the sights in downtown St. Louis and in the suburban area ("the County"). The official events will take you to the Thomas F. Eagleton Courthouse and both Saint Louis University and Washington University. If you are interested in shopping there is the St. Louis Centre with both Famous-Barr and Dillards Department stores. You might also want to explore St. Louis Union Station, which is a National Historic Landmark featuring shops, restaurants, and entertainment.

If you are interested in museums there is the Missouri History Museum and the Saint Louis Art Museum in Forest Park. The Missouri History Museum just completed a major building expansion providing additional exhibit space in four new galleries. The Art Museum, which was designed for the 1904 World's Fair, contains more than 100 galleries, and always has interesting special exhibits. Downtown there is, of course, the Arch and Museum of Westward Expansion. If you are bringing your family, favorite spots for children include the Magic House, the City Museum, the St. Louis Science Center, the Butterfly House, and the St. Louis Zoo.

October should be a beautiful time to visit the world renowned Missouri Botanical Garden which contains specialized gardens as well as inside exhibits. If you are interested in Busch rather than bushes there is always the Anheuser-Busch Brewery, which provides tours and samples. Plan you meeting schedule, but also plan the restaurants, museums, concerts, and other sights you wish to visit. 
